Western Flint Glass Co's.  
Plant in This City.**

**TO ENLARGE PLANT.**

**New Management Purchases Eight  
Acres Adjoining Plant For  
Future Use.**

Negotiations which have been pending for several days were completed yesterday and the Western Flint Glass Company is now the property of the Graham Glass Company, who also have a plant at Okmulgee. The new management took charge yesterday and hope to have the plant running in a few days.

One of the first acts of the new company was the purchasing of eight acres of land adjoining the plant also taking an option on 30 more. A Democrat representative in conversation with the officers of the new company yesterday was told that at present their chief aim is to get the plant running as quickly as possible and later on will probably enlarge the plant thus making use of the extra land purchased. The Graham people will manufacture at this plant pressure bottles exclusively, such as pop bottles, coco cola bottles etc.

The new management will add one or more new machines at once and will also make some changes in the machinery end of the plant which will necessitate a slight delay in starting.

Jacob Keck, of Okmulgee, will have charge of the plant as manager, and W. L. VanMeter will have charge of the machinery end of the business. T. G. McDaniel who has been connected with the Western Flint Glass Co. since it took over the plant several months ago, is undecided as to what he will do, but in all probabilities will remain with the new concern.

Geo. J. Miller, who came to Checotah several months ago and purchased the factory from the Commercial club will in all probabilities return to his former home in Indiana.

The Graham Glass Co. is a big concern and the citizens of this city will be pleased to know that it has fallen into the hands of such well known people, and at the same time will be sorry to lose Mr. Miller who has made many friends during his stay in the city.

Checotah people will always take an interest in this factory as it was the first to locate in this city after our gas field had been proven, thus being you might say the stepping stone to a Greater Checotah.
